

# ANBUG - the Australian Neutron Beam Users Group

## The ANBUG Award for Career Achievements in Neutron Science

**Purpose:** To recognize a *sustained* contribution to a scientific subfield, or subfields, using neutron scattering techniques. Consideration shall be given to the impact that the candidate's neutron scattering results have had on the subfield(s). Preference shall be given to applicants who are members of ANBUG and whose work was carried out primarily in Australia.

**Definition:** The award - consisting of a plaque and a small gift (e.g. relevant book) - will be presented at the AINSE-ANBUG Neutron Scattering Symposium (AANSS) or at a closely related meeting. The recipient will be invited to present a talk at the symposium.

**Selection Committee – The Committee will normally comprise four ANBUG Committee Members including: President (Chair), Vice-President, Secretary and one other.**

**Timing:** The ANBUG Neutron Award is expected to be awarded biennially at the AANSS or at a closely related meeting.

**\*Nominations:** The deadline for receipt of nominations is 3 months before the AANSS (the annual symposium is usually held in December; the nomination deadline would then be 1 September of the same year.)

\*Nominations should include:

- A letter of nomination (2 signatories; both ANBUG members) not to exceed 1000 words evaluating the nominee's qualifications and identifying the specific work to be recognized and how the work has led to the advancement of neutron science.
- The nominee's CV clearly identifying the work that relates to the award nomination. *Do not include reprints unless they are not readily available electronically.*
- Up to two additional letters of support.
- Electronic (e-mail) delivery of all documents in pdf format is preferred. Otherwise send 5 copies of the nomination package to the Secretary of the Selection Committee (ANBUG Secretary < <http://www.anbug.org/> >).
